## House Bill 7069 Frequently Asked Questions <br> June 3, 2015

1. When will the lists be released of students in the bottom quintile for Grade 3 and students meeting the Algebra I FSA EOC and Grade 10 FSA ELA graduation requirements?

We are working to get everything completed in June. The Grade 3 list will be created first and will be released as soon as possible, followed by Algebra I FSA EOC and Grade 10 FSA ELA.
2. For the students retaking or taking for credit (via the Credit Acceleration Program - CAP) the summer 2015 FSA EOCs, will districts get a list indicating who passed before school starts?

For the summer 2015 Algebra I FSA EOC administration, the list of students passing will be distributed as soon after school starts as possible.

Students wishing to CAP credit for Geometry and Algebra 2 through the FSA EOCs taken in spring or summer 2015 will need to wait until after achievement level cut scores are set.
3. Will students taking the FSA EOCs in summer 2015 be considered as having taken the test during the 2014-15 school year and the score not count as 30\%, or will they be considered in the 2015-16 school year and the scores used in the grade for $30 \%$ ?

If the EOC is taken during the spring or summer 2015 administration windows for Algebra I, Algebra II, or Geometry, this is a local decision pending results of the validation study. Districts may choose to establish a policy regarding recalculating course grades for these students when scores are available. If this recommendation is applied, the policy should be applied district-wide to all students for whom the recalculation results in an advantage.

The EOC results from any statewide EOC administration after scores are validated must count for $30 \%$ of the course grade.
4. What will the passing score on Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry FSA EOCs be in order to meet the Scholar designation requirement (if taken in spring or summer 2015)?

Students eligible to graduate in 2014-15 (from the 2013-2014 9th grade cohort or older) who sat for the EOC exams and earned credit in the Geometry and Algebra II courses remain eligible for a Scholar designation if all other criteria are met.

Students eligible to graduate in future years will need to wait for achievement level cut scores to be set.
