2012-13 FTE General Instructions

This document is intended to assist school districts in reporting full-time equivalent (FTE) students as required by Section 1011.62(1)(a), Florida Statutes (F.S.).

The 2012-13 Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) July FTE student survey was conducted the week of July 9-13, 2012. The FTE student data from this survey will be used in the third calculation of the 2012-13 FEFP. The attached FTE reporting instructions include a summary of changes for 2012-13, the July FTE certification form letter, a list of current program numbers with appropriate cost factors, and a schedule of reporting deadlines through 2015-16.

"Date certain" for all schools in all school districts is Friday of survey week. "Date certain" is the specific time for setting the student's schedule on the local student course record. It is used for reporting the "FTE Earned, Course" data element.

Minimum Hourly Requirement for Grade PK-3 Students

Section 1011.61(1)(a)1., F.S., defines a full-time equivalent student in kindergarten through grade 3 as a student who receives not less than 720 net instruction hours. When reporting class minutes for a student in kindergarten through grade 3, the basis for the conversion to a 1500 minute schedule is 720 hours. For more detail regarding this conversion, please see page 11 of the FTE General Instructions.

FEFP Program Reporting Priority

Section 15 of Chapter 2012-133, Laws of Florida, changes course record reporting priority requirements. Course records for Career Education, English for Speakers of Other Languages, and Exceptional Student Education are no longer required to be reported for funding before basic programs.

Location of Student

A new data element, "Location of Student," has been added to the Student Course Schedule Record. This data element identifies the physical location of the student during the majority of the instructional time for the virtual instruction course. Please consult the 2012-13 Automated Student Information System Data Base Manual, Student Course Schedule format, Location of Student data element, for specific reporting detail regarding this new data element.

FTE Student Data to be Reported

The FEFP provides funding for the 180-day regular school year, except for certain specific exceptions. Students attending Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) facilities are funded for a 230- to 250-day school year. With the exception of DJJ facilities, Juveniles Incompetent to Proceed (JITP) programs, and the Florida Virtual School (FLVS) students in grades 6-12 receiving part-time instruction, prekindergarten through grade 12 courses offered beyond the regular school year are funded through the Supplemental Academic Instruction and Reading allocations. Although funding for such courses does not depend on reported FTE student data, districts are still required to report summer non-funded FTE student data in the Automated Student Information System so that associated statistical reports can be generated.

The FEFP provides funding for more than 180 days only for students attending DJJ facilities, for students enrolled in JITP programs, and for successful completion of direct instruction courses through the FLVS by students in grades 6-12 receiving part-time instruction. Therefore, the only fundable FTE for programs for more than 180 days, as presented in the FTE student data certification letter for the July and June surveys, should be for students attending DJJ facilities, which include Practical Academic and Cultural Education Centers for Girls and Marine Institutes; for students enrolled in JITP programs; and for students in grades 6-12 who successfully complete direct instruction courses from the FLVS on a part-time basis.

In addition to the FTE student data for programs that operate for more than 180 days, the FTE student data for credit completions or the prescribed level of content that counts toward promotion to the next grade in programs listed in Section 1011.62(1)(c), F.S., should be reported in the June survey for the following programs: school district virtual instruction programs (s.

1002.45, F.S.), district virtual course offerings (s. 1003.498, F.S.), charter virtual school programs (s. 1002.33, F.S.), the FLVS full-time program (s. 1002.37, F.S.), the FLVS part-time program serving students in grades kindergarten through 5, and franchises of the FLVS (s. 1002.37(4), F.S.). Students who successfully complete a virtual instruction course should be reported in the June survey with a total *FTE Earned, Course*, across all courses reported, up to 1.0000. A virtual instruction course that is not successfully completed should be reported in the June survey with *FTE Earned, Course* equal to 0.0000.

Exceptional Education Student Record

With the exception of students in the John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities program, the FTE student data records of students receiving exceptional education services (FEFP program numbers 111, 112, 113, 254, and 255) must have a matching exceptional education student record to generate funding under the FEFP.

Classroom Identification, Florida Inventory of School Houses (FISH) Number

To generate funding under the FEFP, each teacher course record for courses taught in a school district classroom in surveys 2 and 3 must contain a valid classroom identification FISH number that matches a number on the FISH file.

General Information

Please refer to the attached 2012-13 FTE General Instructions for assistance with student eligibility, reporting criteria, instructions for the Automated Student Information System, and reporting deadlines. Significant changes for 2012-13 are identified on page i of the report. The system cutoff date for reporting July survey data is Sunday, September 30, 2012. All database input must be complete as of this date. The attached form letter, which certifies the July fundable FTE student data, must be signed by the superintendent or designee and submitted no later than Friday, October 5, 2012. The FTE student survey unweighted funded FTE student totals provided in this letter must match the totals reported in the database as of the system cutoff date. Districts may use FTE Report 05.107 to verify FTE student data recorded in the database for use in the certification letter. The information in this letter will be compared with the Department's report to ensure that accurate information is used in the FEFP funding formula. Please note that only fundable FTE student data should be reported in the FTE student data certification letter.

Report 60.021, "Supplemental FTE Data File List," is available upon request. This report provides data regarding the Department of Children and Families, Department of Juvenile Justice, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and Advanced International Certificate of Education programs. School districts can use this report to verify the FTE in these programs.

Section 1002.37, F.S., authorizes the FLVS to provide part-time instruction for students in kindergarten through grade 5. Section 1003.498, F.S., authorizes school districts to offer individual virtual courses for students enrolled in the school district. Eligible students may also register and enroll in an online course offered by any other school district in the state, except as limited by Section 1003.498(2)(b), F.S. In each of these situations, the district and the virtual

provider must agree in advance on how to report the student so that the FTE does not exceed 1.0000 for the year. The Department of Education has developed the attached agreement forms to assist in documenting the joint instructional process.
